

USA JUMP ROPE

2012 Criteria for Staff in Training Selection

Applications for USAJR Staff in Training (SIT) must include a Staff in Training (SIT) Application Form, a Camp Registration Form, and a Teaching Staff Leadership Standards and Responsibilities Form. (Forms are attached.) Also please enclose two (2) photos with your application. Coaches must complete the Recommendation Form for each nominee from their team and mail in separately. The nominee completes the Teaching Staff Application Form and a Camp Registration Form. The following is a list of criteria for Teaching Staff eligibility.

The applicant must the following qualifications:

- ✓ Be a current member of USAJR.
- ✓ Have completed 6th grade or higher by the first day of camp
- ✓ Submit a completed Teaching Staff Application Form, a Camp Registration Form, and a signed Teaching Staff Leadership Standards Form to the USAJR Office postmarked by **March 15, 2012**.
- ✓ Have a recommendation from his/her coach mailed separately to USAJR.
- ✓ Have three (3) years teaching experience at sanctioned or non sanctioned USA Jump Rope Camps and/or Workshops
- ✓ One (1) year attendance at a USA Jump Rope sanctioned Camp. *USA Jump Rope All-Star team members are exempt from this requirement.*
- ✓ Be highly skilled in single rope, double Dutch, wheel, long rope, and group routines.
- ✓ Have workshop staff experience.
- ✓ Possess excellent leadership and teaching skills with extensive knowledge of jump rope.
- ✓ Must Be able to arrive at camp two days early or at the discretion of the Camp Director
- ✓ Be able to stay for the entire camp and participate in all activities.
- ✓ Submit a \$50 deposit with your application.

APPLICATION FEE: \$50 (this is a deposit only and will be returned if you are chosen for Teaching Staff. If you are not chosen for Teaching Staff, you will have the choice of applying the \$50 deposit toward your camp registration fee or receiving a refund).

- 4) Signed Teaching Staff Leadership Standards Form**

TEACHING STAFF LEADERSHIP STANDARDS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Demonstrate mature behavior and positive attitude at all times.
2. Show respect to all adults, staff members, coaches, and campers at all times. Do what is asked without complaint.
3. Conduct yourself as a role model and ambassador for USA Jump Rope and the campers.
4. Remember that you will be responsible for this group of jumpers. Find space for them to jump, stay with them always, and keep them active. Contact an Administrative Staff member if you need to excuse yourself from your group. If a jumper has mastered a skill before others in the group, challenge them to learn it backwards or in a double under.
5. Learn the names of each jumper in your group, and allow them to take a break when they need it.
6. Be patient, friendly, and encouraging to everyone. Make it **FUN!**
7. Show each skill without the rope. Don't always face your jumpers while demonstrating. Turn and allow the jumpers to see you demonstrate the skill from behind so they can copy your movements.
 - Break each skill into parts.
 - Check each jumper's movement without the rope or without jumping.
 - Check each jumper with his or her rope. Correct the jumper's mistakes if necessary.
8. Be friendly and willing to answer questions.
9. Accept responsibility for personal behavior and belongings including ropes.
10. Abide by all camp and staff rules.
11. Maintain a healthy presence and a clean uniform; this includes keeping your shirt tucked in at all times.
12. Be present and on time for all sessions and assignments.
13. Maintain your composure throughout your leadership experience.
14. Remember that you are a wonderful role model for these jumpers and we are proud of you!
15. Be ready to work hard and have lots of fun!

I have read the above listed Standards for Teaching Staff position, I understand each item listed and further I understand that if at anytime during Camp, I do not follow the Responsibilities and or Standards I may be removed from Teaching Staff and or removed from Camp.
